We will examine characteristic structures, styles, and themes, in order to situate these stories in their literary and historical contexts. Truman Capote's 'Miriam', Ray Bradbury's 'There Will Come Soft Rains', James Baldwin's 'Sonny's Blues', Thomas Pynchon's 'Entropy', John Cheever's 'The Swimmer', and William Gass's 'Order of Insects'.
